

A reading from The Prophet Isaiah (49: 1-7)

Listen to me, O coastlands, pay attention, you peoples from far away The LORD called me before I was born, while I was in my mother's womb he named me. ² He made my mouth like a sharp sword in the shadow of his hand he hid me; he made me a polished arrow, in his quiver he hid me away. ³ And he said to me, 'You are my servant, Israel, in whom I will be glorified.' ⁴ But I said, 'I have labored in vain, I have spent my strength for nothing and vanity; yet surely my cause is with the LORD, and my reward with my God.' ⁵ And now the LORD says, who formed me in the womb to be his servant, to bring Jacob back to him, and that Israel might be gathered to him, for I am honoured in the sight of the LORD, and my God has become my strength— ⁶ he says, 'It is too light a thing that you should be my servant to raise up the tribes of Jacob and to restore the survivors of Israel; I will give you as a light to the nations, that my salvation may reach to the end of the earth.' ⁷ Thus says the LORD, the Redeemer of Israel and his Holy One, to one deeply despised, abhorred by the nations, the slave of rulers, 'Kings shall see and stand up, princes, and they shall prostrate themselves, because of the LORD, who is faithful, the Holy One of Israel, who has chosen you.'

- 4 *Happy are they who trust in the LORD! * they do not resort to evil spirits or turn to false gods.*

* there is none who can be compared with you.

I have spoken of your faithfulness and your deliverance;
* I have not concealed your love and faithfulness from the
great congregation.

12 *You are the LORD; do not withhold your compassion
from me; * let your love and your faithfulness keep me
safe for ever,*

¹Paul, called to be an apostle of Christ Jesus by the will of God,
and our brother Sosthenes, ²To the church of God that is in
Corinth, to those who are sanctified in Christ Jesus, called to be
saints, together with all those who in every place call on the
name of our Lord Jesus Christ, both their Lord* and ours
³Grace to you and peace from God our Father and the Lord
Jesus Christ. ⁴I give thanks to my* God always for you because
of the grace of God that has been given you in Christ Jesus, ⁵for
in every way you have been enriched in him, in speech and
knowledge of every kind— ⁶just as the testimony of* Christ has
been strengthened among you— ⁷so that you are not lacking in
any spiritual gift as you wait for the revealing of our Lord Jesus
Christ. ⁸He will also strengthen you to the end, so that you may
be blameless on the day of our Lord Jesus Christ. ⁹God is

*The Holy Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ, according to John 1
(29-42)*

People Glory to you, Lord Christ.

29 The next day he saw Jesus coming towards him and declared, 'Here is the Lamb of God who takes away the sin of the world! 30 This is he of whom I said, "After me comes a man who ranks ahead of me because he was before me." 31 I myself did not know him; but I came baptizing with water for this reason, that he might be revealed to Israel.' 32 And John testified, 'I saw the Spirit descending from heaven like a dove, and it remained on him. 33 I myself did not know him, but the one who sent me to baptize with water said to me, "He on whom you see the Spirit descend and remain is the one who baptizes with the Holy Spirit." 34 And I myself have seen and have testified that this is the Son of God.'* 35 The next day John again was standing with two of his disciples, 36 and as he watched Jesus walk by, he exclaimed, 'Look, here is the Lamb of God!' 37 The two disciples heard him say this, and they followed Jesus. 38 When Jesus turned and saw them following, he said to them, 'What are you looking for?' They said to him, 'Rabbi' (which translated means Teacher), 'where are you staying?' 39 He said to them, 'Come and see.' They came and saw where he was staying, and they remained with him that day. It was about four o'clock in the afternoon. 40 One of the two who heard John speak and followed him was Andrew, Simon Peter's brother. 41 He first found his brother Simon and said to him, 'We have found the Messiah' (which is translated Anointed*). 42 He brought Simon* to Jesus, who looked at him and said, 'You are Simon son of John. You are to be called Cephas' (which is translated Peter*).



Meditation: "Spontaneous Witnessing"

When Christ has been revealed to us it should be almost impossible for us to be quiet about it. (*John 1:29 & 36*) bear witness to this. John the Baptist sees Jesus walking alongside the road and he cannot contain himself from proclaiming. "Here is the Lamb of God who takes away the sin of the world!" It is John's natural impulse to share the good news when the Good News is present in his life. Because of John's bold proclamation, two others follow Jesus and become his disciples. Sometimes our best and most effective witnessing is done when we are simply but boldly acknowledging the presence of God in our lives. The sincere recognition of and excitement about what God is up to in our lives can be enough to inspire others to wonder about who this Jesus is. In this text Jesus invites the two men to "come and see" (*John 1:39*). They do, and they invite others to do the same. John's role was to tell aloud what he knew to be true, what he had experienced in his own life. We, too, can invite others to come and see. Have we ever been so assured of Christ's presence in our daily lives that we have shouted it aloud almost impulsively? Are there times when God's grace is so tangible in our lives that we can't help but witness to it? Have we ever encountered people like John the Baptist who seem so attuned to God's presence that we long to be around them, hoping to catch glimpses of God? Let us pray for hearts to receive Jesus' revelations and mouths to proclaim his presence among us.


